 - i. About 20.
 - g. Awards for programming team winners and best papers were discussed.
 - i. What were awarded at the past few conferences?
 - ii. Final decision:
 1. \$100 per student for first place programming team.
 2. \$75 per student for second place programming team.
 3. \$50 per student for third place programming team.
 4. \$200 per best paper.
 - h. Certificates of participation will be presented to programming team members and paper submissions.
 - i. Question re important dates.
 - i. Referred to conference site.
 - j. Request to members to ask faculty interested in reviewing to contact D. Mooney.
 - k. (online discussion 02/10) Question was raised as to cost for members' spouses who attend the conference.
 - i. After discussion, will charge student rates this year.

 - i. M. Jones – Lock Haven has *computational thinking* course.
 1. Not sure what will be done beyond this.
 - ii. L. Kovalchik – Have technology literacy course.
Reduced from 6 to 3 credits under current curriculum.
 - iii. P. Mullins – Colleagues think students think they're literate already.
 - iv. J. Emert – East Stroudsburg's provost has the same opinion.
 - v. R. Montante – Problems getting people to teach gen ed courses.
General discussion of using part-time faculty for this and limitations of full-time to part-time ratio mandated by CVA.
- d. Job fair status.
 - i. Y. Zhang reported that conference rooms are available at Dixon Center every Friday in September/October at a cost of \$200 and \$250.
 - ii. Suggested that each school invite its employers to participate, and schools with graduate programs promote their programs.
 - iii. Question of whether students from distant schools would travel the distance to attend?
 - iv. Would employers travel that distance?
 1. Attraction to employers is that would have students from 14 schools.
 - v. Suggested that we try it at this year's conference with grad programs .
 1. Students will not have to make an extra drive to attend.
 2. California will see if local employers have an interest.
 3. Proposed Friday 12 to 5.
